Going forward, they will be working on "eye exercises" to improve their "visual" abilities, as well as cognitive training (Cog-Training) to strengthen cognitive functions such as "memorization," "counting," "copying," "discovery," and "idea formation."

For the hands-on learning, 1st and 2nd graders tried out traditional games in the classrooms and the workspace. 3rd graders learned about the charms of Mt. Hatobuki from the Hatobukiyama Tomono-Kai. 4th graders made "bamboo lantern art" with the help of the "Kisogawa Toriberu" Volunteer Group. 5th graders learned about elderly welfare from a member of the Social Welfare Council, and 6th graders learned about Kani City's multicultural coexistence initiatives from a lecturer at the International Exchange Association.
